COIR DOOR MAT CARE & MAINTENANCE GUIDE

EVERYTHING YOU NEED TO KNOW



Coir matting is normally left in situation and forgotten about. However to prolong the life of your new mat you may wish to turn the mat upside down occasionally to remove any dirt built up in the piles or vacuum regularly.

Coir matting is very absorbent and it is not recommended to saturate the mat if attempting to clean it. Dry foam or a cleaning powder should be used to remove any stubborn marks. Do not use any solvents (i.e. White Spirit or turpentine) as this will cause the backing to expand which can damage the coir fibres and pile loss may occur.

Mud and wet dirt stains should be left to dry and removed with a stiff brush or vacuumed. Chewing gum can be removed with a freeze spray obtainable from a good hardware store.

Please note that coloured coir matting is natural coir that is dyed, therefore it can be prone to fade in direct sun light and with heavy wear and tear.
